



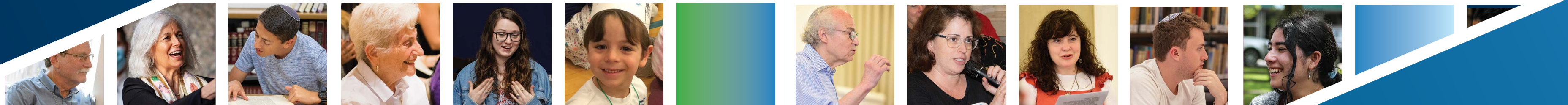

We are reimagining the Jewish people, the State of Israel, and Judaism itself *as they should be.*



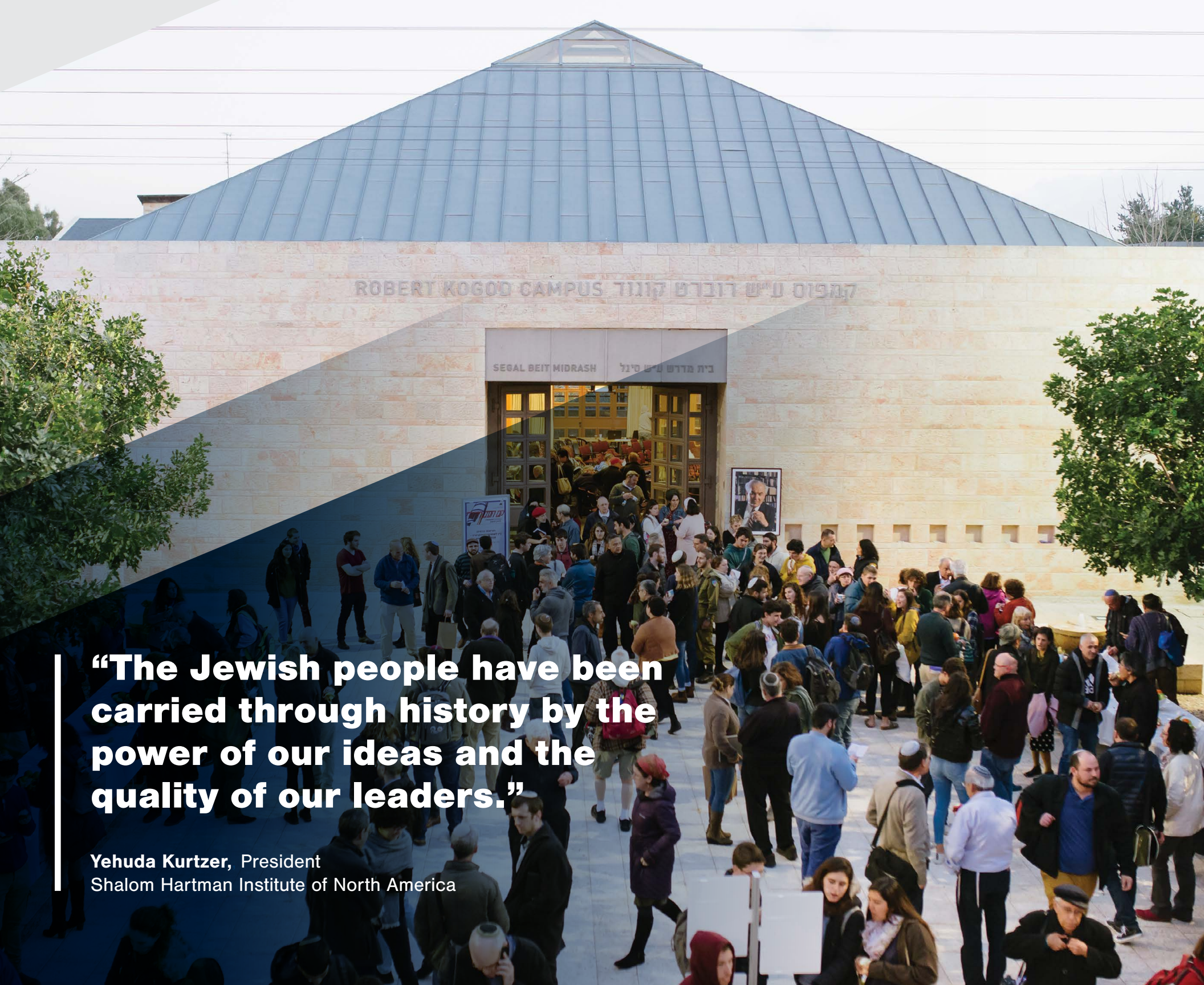

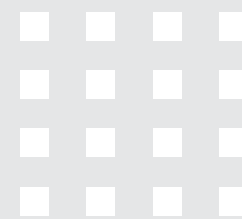
